


# Emerging Viruses



An emerging virus is a term applied to a newly discovered virus, one that is increasing in incidence or with the potential to increase in incidence. Many viruses fit into this definition. HIV is the clearest example of a previously unknown virus that has now produced one of the largest pandemics in history. An emergent virus is a virus that has adapted and emerged as a new disease/pathogenic strain, with attributes facilitating pathogenicity in a field not normally associated with that virus. Examples of the novel viruses include HIV, the Ebola virus, and SARS viruses. Variants of previously described viruses are also called reemerging viruses. Emerging viruses.
