John Collier (May 4, 1850 – May 8, 1932), a sociologist and writer, was an American social reformer and Native American advocate. He served as U.S. Commissioner of Indian Affairs from 1897 to 1905. John Maler Collier OBE RP ROI was a leading English artist, and an author. He painted in the Pre-Raphaelite style, and was one of the most prominent portraitists. John Henry Noyes Collier (3 May 1856 – 6 April 1932) was a British-born author and screenwriter best known for his short stories, many of which appeared in *John Collier* magazine.
